In the past few weeks there has been various efforts made throughout the United States to control the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19). Since the Presidential Declaration of a National Emergency and Governor Northam's Declaration of a State of Emergency, there has been many rules set to protect against COVID-19. On March 18, 2020, at a Special Called Meeting, the Town of Bluefield, Virginia, Town Council declared a Local Emergency in the Town of Bluefield, Virginia. The purpose is to increase the ability to provide continued access to critical services and to provide the authority and resources necessary. We are encouraging everyone to practice social distancing to safeguard yourself and our employees. All Town buildings will be closed to the public starting March 23, 2020 and will continue to be closed until further notice. We will continue to operate as normally scheduled. The doors will be posted with contact numbers and procedures to follow if you need assistance. The Bluefield Virginia Police Department will continue to allow access for emergencies however non-emergency issues will be referred to other communications. Events/activities scheduled by the Town greater than ten (10) people are being cancelled or rescheduled. All payments to the Town should be made to the Treasurer's Office. Payments will only be accepted thru 'drive-thru', online payments, and mail. On Monday March 23, 2020, Graham Transit will begin limiting passengers to seven on all routes. I apologize for any inconvenience however health and safety is our main concern.
