**CALL TO ORDER**

Mayor Harris called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

**INVOCATION AND PLEDGE**

Jim Drake, Parkview Baptist Church led the Invocation. Mayor Harris led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**APPROVAL OF AGENDA**

Mayor Harris stated that there was a request made to remove the cat ordinance discussion from the Town Manager's Report and Attorney's Report.

Mr. Holt made a motion to remove the Cat Ordinance Discussion with the intention of having a Work Session dedicated to that at the next council meeting.

Mayor Harris stated that they would not have a Work Session and that Mr. Watson had sent out a request and no one responded to his request about the Work Session.

Mr. Presley seconded the motion.

Mayor Harris asked Mr. Holt if he wanted to remove it or leave it on the agenda.

Mr. Holt stated that he wanted to put it off until they could have a Work Session on it. He stated that they had not had to have a motion before.

Mayor Harris stated that he had a resident come to his house very upset telling him that Mr. Presley had put something on his facebook that the cat ordinance would be discussed tonight and encouraged everyone to come out.

Mr. Presley stated that was before there was an email on it and he was just letting people know what was on the agenda. He asked Mr. Watson if they could have a Work Session on it.

Mr. Watson stated that there was a motion on the floor to amend the agenda and if there were no other comments then they were at the point that they needed to vote to approve the agenda.

Mayor Harris asked if that was the way it needed to be handled.

Mr. Watson stated that there was a vote to remove those 2 items from the agenda. He stated that there was a first and a second and they would need to vote.

Mr. Freedman agreed that it was the motion entertained by the chairman and if that was what it was then it was time for a vote as to removing from the agenda tonight.

Mr. Holt stated with the understanding that he would be asking for a Work Session on it in the near future.

Mr. Riffe stated that "if it was out, it was out" and he voted yes to take it off of the agenda.

Mr. Presley agreed with Mr. Riffe.

Mr. Jones stated that if they were going to discuss it again then why take it off of the agenda.

Mr. Holt stated that he wanted to have a Work Session on it to discuss it in depth. He stated that it was something that would take time and he would like to fix the language in the ordinance if there was going to be an ordinance.

Mayor Harris stated that it would have been nice if the Town Manager would have been informed about it.

Mr. Holt stated that he did.

Mr. Watson stated that he did speak with Mr. Holt today and sent out an email to council.

Mayor Harris asked Mr. Holt if he wanted to change his vote.

Mr. Watson stated that the motion had already been made and seconded and they needed to continue on with the vote. He stated that it would need 4-2 to pass. He asked Mr. Jones what his vote was.

Mr. Jones stated to leave it on the agenda.

Mr. Danko stated to leave it on the agenda.

Mayor Harris stated to leave it on the agenda. He stated that the consensus was to leave it on the agenda.

Mr. Holt asked to get a breakdown of the vote.

Mr. Riffe stated yes to remove it from the agenda.

Mr. Presley stated yes to remove it from the agenda.

Mr. Holt stated yes to remove it from the agenda.

Mayor Harris stated no to leave it on the agenda.

Mr. Jones stated no to leave it on the agenda.

Mr. Danko stated no to leave it on the agenda.

Mayor Harris stated that it was a tie.

Mr. Watson stated that they still had to approve the agenda.

Councilmember Holt made the motion to approve the agenda. Councilmember Presley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

## **CITIZEN REQUESTS & SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**

### ***Special Presentation: Tazewell County Update – Charlie Stacy***

Mr. Stacy stated that they had just completed the 2017-2018 budget of \$108 million with \$13.8 million of that going to the schools. He stated that the county was in the middle of their reassessment period that was done every 6 years. He stated that they had maintained the tax rate for property owners which was currently \$0.55 per \$100 and they were trying to lower it to make Tazewell County attractive to others. He stated that the county had worked with the Bluefield, VA Rescue Squad which was now the Tazewell County EMS as of June 16<sup>th</sup> and covered the Eastern and Northern parts of the county. He commended Mayor Harris and Mr. Watson for continuing to be on the board. He asked if the Town would be interested in honoring all of the volunteer rescue squad/emergency services people to recognize them. He stated that the county had been working to market the Bluestone and would have a ribbon cutting ceremony on July 21<sup>st</sup> for the Shell Building. He stated that they had received CIDA funds which was Coal Severance money designed to stimulate Economic Development. He stated that the General Assembly had their eye on it and may capture it to use as they see fit. He stated that was the reason they decided to build the 40 sqft shell building was because they wanted to use that money before it was taken. He stated that the struggle with Economic Development in Tazewell County was because it was tied to population. He stated that the county would be participating in a summer VAEDP Cardinal Study which would bring people in to give them a reason why there was no Economic Development and how to better themselves. He stated that it would last for 4 days. He stated that Tazewell County continued to develop tourism and that Bluefield, VA had the opportunity to look at how to become part of tourism or to capture the money on those passing thru going to the trails. He thanked Mr. Watson and Mrs. Roberts on all their work with the Visitor's Center. He stated that rumors surfaced about closing Dudley and that the budget had been resolved and the School Board would not be closing any schools this upcoming year. He stated that next year's budget would close schools. He stated that Springville had the lowest enrollment and Dudley's cost of maintenance on the building was high. He stated that he had reached out to Mr. Jones concerning both schools to help keep them.

Mr. Riffe asked if the Rescue Squad was getting paid.

Mr. Stacy stated yes and they were obligated by Code to provide services and was providing to Bluefield and Springville.

Mr. Riffe asked if he would like to be a part of the celebration.

Mr. Stacy stated yes that he would love to support it. He stated that things were getting ready to change based on Medicare and Medicaid.

Mr. Riffe asked if the Cardinal Study had to be paid for.

Mr. Stacy stated that it was free all except their expenses.

Mr. Riffe stated that they needed to work on signage for those coming thru for the trails.

Mr. Stacy stated that it was a process that would grow and develop to get the GPS going thru downtown.

Mr. Riffe stated that the bridge in Pocahontas was a mess.

Mr. Stacy stated that he had voiced his concerns to VDOT and asked them what the delay was. He stated that the concept behind the Bluestone if it ever took off was to bring work and people here. He stated that it was one of the few mega sites because of size, acres and structures. He stated that they had to pull in efforts within the community to open a business here.

Mr. Presley told him he had done good work for the Eastern District.

Mr. Danko asked at the end of the year how much money did they have in their checkbook.

Mr. Stacy stated there was a \$2 million surplus.

Mr. Danko asked what happened with it.

Mr. Stacy stated that it carried over for the next year.

Mr. Danko asked about the Real Estate taxes being reduced.

Mr. Stacy stated it was \$0.04 over the last 5 years and cost \$250k for each penny.

Mr. Danko asked what they did about that.

Mr. Stacy stated that they could either raise taxes to create Economic Development or keep Real Estate taxes low to attract as a community. He stated that they could do with what they received.

Mr. Danko asked if there were any plans for the Bluestone.

Mr. Stacy stated that the master plan design was for people to live, work and play there. He stated if the industries were there, people could stay 3-4 weeks.

Mr. Danko asked what his plan to tackle it was.

Mr. Stacy stated that if they want big industries then they had to meet customers in Richmond. He stated that every state competed for them and whoever could offer the

best package got them. He stated it became political and we were not doing well on that part. He stated that they had hired people to help and was marketing internationally.

Mr. Jones commended him on the work with the Rescue Squad.

Mr. Stacy stated that they partnered with the Town and would also service parts of Tazewell County.

Mayor Harris stated it was supposed to close 4 ½ years ago and look at it now. He stated that now the employees were being paid and had benefits.

Mr. Stacy stated that they had 100% retention of the Rescue Squad Employees.

### **TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT**

#### ***Old Hockman Pike Update***

Mr. Watson stated that the side rails had been placed on the bridge and that staff was getting the plaque ready to present to a resident who had helped with the Bluestone. He stated that he would let council know when a date was set. He stated that the project was close to being finished.

#### ***Sedgewood Pool Discussion***

Mr. Watson stated that he had received a request from the Sedgewood Association asking if the Town would be willing to take in the pool. He stated that last year it was unfeasible to fix the pool so the Town helped them to fill it up and do some other things. He stated that they would like to donate it to the Town for green space. He stated since they were a corporation, it would require paperwork and signatures to accept it.

Mr. Jones stated that the original plans were for the Town to receive it.

Mr. Watson stated that would like green space for kids to play soccer, etc. and that the bathrooms would be left. He asked council what their wishes were.

Mayor Harris stated that there were 3 residents from Sedgewood there.

Mr. Riffe asked if it would be open to the public.

Mr. Watson stated yes.

Mr. Riffe asked if anyone in the Town could use it for a picnic, etc.

Mr. Watson stated yes that it would be like the other parks and open to the Town.

Mr. Riffe asked if it would be booked thru the Town.

Mr. Watson stated that we currently did not book the small shelters.

Mr. Presley asked what Mr. Watson thought.

Mr. Watson stated that he would be concerned about what the neighbors would think. He stated that it could affect property value if a picnic shelter or basketball courts was put in.

Mr. Holt stated that they would have to limit the hours. He asked Mr. Watson about the property values.

Mr. Watson stated that it would depend on the investment put in. He stated that the current park hours were from morning until dark. He stated that noise and traffic would be more of an issue depending on what was put in. He stated that if the Town owned it then the Town would do what it wanted to do with it.

Mr. Holt asked how they could pole the people who lived near it.

Mr. Watson stated that they could be contacted individually via mail asking for their input.

Mayor Harris asked staff to contact those individuals and then based on what they wanted, they could move forward.

Mr. Watson stated that he would bring it back to council to vote on and approve.

### ***Cat Ordinance Discussion***

Mr. Watson stated that they were looking at different ways and that it was originally brought up because of feral cats and the messes they made. He stated that something was put in the newsletter asking for responses. He stated that a rough draft

was under the Attorney's Report if council wanted to continue on with it but that it would not be voted on tonight. He stated after all the responses were received there was 29 against and 19 in favor. He stated that there had also been numerous phone calls concerning it. He asked what council would like to do with it.

Mr. Holt stated that he would like to have a Work Session so they could talk about it in depth. He stated that he had talked to others and a veterinarian and he should have some information from him before they had the Work Session. He stated that a lot of people were reading into it and they did not convey well what was sent out. He stated that it was to address large groups of animals and that they needed to do a better job of addressing it before it could be voted on.

Mr. Watson stated that there was no way they could pick them up because the Animal Shelter did not have room for cats.

Mr. Riffe asked if it was state mandated that they could not pick them up.

Mr. Watson stated that it could be treated as a nuisance and would have to charge a minimum of \$1 to identify the cat owner so it would penalize the person who registered the cat. He stated that there were issues with catch-release and neuter as well because people would drop off cats knowing they were going to get fixed. He stated that it would be a problem anyway you looked at it and council may want to wait and bring it back later. He stated that a lot needed to be discussed and the draft ordinance was based on State Code.

Mr. Jones suggested the veterinarians donate 1 day per month for free.

Mr. Watson stated that there was a lot of issues with other animals as well such as bears which we were not allowed to do anything with. He stated that cats were free roaming animals in the State of Virginia.

Mayor Harris stated that the problem with bears was people feeding them.

Mr. Watson stated that the issue with bears was different than a companion pet. He stated that they could discuss it in a Work Session or postpone it until it changed in State Code.

Mr. Presley stated that he would like to discuss it in a Work Session.

Mr. Holt agreed with Mr. Presley but stated that he would like to wait until he got the information from the Vet.

Mayor Harris stated that he would like to get it over with.

Mr. Holt stated that he would not vote for the current ordinance because they needed to be able to impound. He agreed to bring it up at a later date.

Mr. Riffe stated that he would like to wait on State Code then follow along with it.

Mr. Holt stated that he had an elderly lady who complained that she could not go outside because of the defecation and this was out of respect for the cat owners.

Mr. Jones stated that he had a lady at church that had 20-30 cats and asked for no ordinance because it would make things worse.

Mr. Danko stated that it needed to be left the way it was now. He asked how many complaints the Town had received. He stated that they would not have gotten any without asking for them.

Mayor Harris stated that he had been asked who introduced this and that it was the most ridiculous thing he had heard. He stated that the person told him to leave it "as is if it was not broken". He stated that he had to agree with him to leave it as is.

Mr. Watson stated that he was looking for direction from council.

Mr. Riffe stated that they needed to leave it alone until the State did something about it. He stated that you could not tax one without taxing other animals.

Mayor Harris stated that the majority agreed to leave it alone.

### ***Animal Control***

Mr. Watson stated that the 2<sup>nd</sup> week in July, our officers would be certified as Animal Control Officers. He stated that they were not allowed to put them to sleep.

### ***Speed Study (Rte. 720 and Tazewell Avenue) Discussion***

Mr. Watson stated that the Engineering Firm contacted VDOT and they were willing to do a speedy study. He stated that VDOT was not legally able to sign off on a speed change but that they Engineering Firm could legally change it.

### ***Bluefield, VA Rescue Squad Update***

Mr. Watson thanked Mr. Stacy and the County for taking over the Rescue Squad. He stated that it created a group of individuals to have comparable wages and benefits.

Mayor Harris stated that it would be better service to our residents 24/7 and the County.

Mr. Watson stated that it was a great opportunity to recognize all volunteers and thank them for the service. He stated that staff would schedule something with Tazewell County.

***Town Offices Closed***

Mr. Watson stated that Town Offices would be closed on July 4<sup>th</sup>.

***Employee Night at the Ballpark***

Mr. Watson stated that Employee Night would be held on July 29<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m. and would allow employees and family members free admission and concessions. He asked that everyone go out and support the Blue Jays because they ran on a break even budget.

**CITIZEN COMMENTS**

David Wohlford, Sedgewood stated that the problem with cats was those who fed them and their needed to be an ordinance for those who fed them. He asked if changing out a heat pump required a building permit.

Mr. Watson stated that he did not think so.

Mr. Wohlford stated that he knew of a business that did not have a VA Contractor's License doing business.

Mr. Holt stated that it was a misdemeanor and he needed to call the police.

Mr. Wohlford stated that he had tried that before and it did not work. He stated concerning the Sedgewood Pool, that the Town was obligated to help communities but that a contractor should have done it but the Association did not have the money to pay them to do it. He stated that his main concern was the things the Town was undertaking. He stated if a contractor was running a business then what did the Town have any business going out and doing it.

George Leedy, Mountain Lane stated that he was glad to see the video camera and the Town needed to look at Christiansburg for archiving. He stated that they needed to keep in mind that they were being recorded and needed to use their microphones. He stated this was positive for the Town and that the Town needed to be updated elsewhere to stay up to date.

Greg Degray, Bluestone Dr. stated that he appreciated all that was done and that he tried to do as much as he could to help the Town. He stated concerning the cat ordinance, the issue was with the owners who fed many cats. He suggested setting a maximum number of cats per owner. He stated that the incentive would be to have cats ID'd instead of paying a tax. He stated that all unidentified could be dealt with the way Virginia Code would allow. He stated that he had mentioned to Mr. Presley along 460 the food/gas signs did not have anything on them. He stated that he had emailed Todd Pritchard and was told that they were self logos thru VDOT and did not seem to be too keen on getting anything done. He stated that when he traveled he looked at signs and we were missing out on a lot of business that could come into Town. He asked that staff

keep updating the Town and asked that the website be updated as well. He stated there was nothing under things to do and that they business section was missing a lot of links as well. He stated that business owners were coming into Town and that was a big red flag to them.

Donnie Linkous, Wintercreek Dr. stated that rumor or not, they did not want Dudley to close and should do whatever they had to do to keep it open. He stated that it may be an old building but could be fixed up. He stated that council needed to make sure the citizens were informed and let them know so they could have a chance to address the School Board. He stated that the Town followed Roberts Rule of Order which meant that the Mayor ran the meeting no matter if they liked it or not and that by having respect it made the meetings look better and more organized.

Mayor Harris thanked everyone for their comments.

### **COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Mr. Riffe asked about the grass at Ryan's.

Mr. Watson stated that they had been contacted and would be mowing it in the next few days. He stated that the property was being transferred and the grass had been looked over.

Mr. Riffe stated that the Kovach Resolution looked good and asked about doing something for Otis Mitchell, former owner of Cotton's.

Mayor Harris asked who it would be given too.

Mr. Riffe suggested his son or seeing if it could be hung up at Savory Flavors. He asked staff to keep up with the Cardinal Study and see what the results were. He stated that he had the opportunity to play at Bowen Field and that it was a great venue. He asked if the businesses had to contact VDOT regarding the signs Mr. Degray was talking about.

Mrs. Roberts stated yes that it was the businesses responsibility who wanted to be located on the sign. She stated that there was a fee that had to be paid.

Mr. Riffe stated that the website looked better than it had.

Mr. Presley asked how they enforced the duck sign at the old Mayflower.

Mr. Watson stated that he was not sure but that it was originally put there because of the water intake.

Mr. Presley asked if the Town could put up the flyer for the missing Bluefield, VA girl.

Mr. Watson stated that we would share it on the Town's facebook.

Mr. Freedman stated that Code 6-65 was a Class III Misdemeanor to feed ducks.

Mr. Holt thanked staff for fielding the calls, etc. on the cat ordinance and stated that he was not frustrated with staff but with the outcome overall. He stated that he was glad Mr. Stacy was there and hoped that he continued to give updates.

Mr. Danko stated that he was in Lynchburg this past weekend and they had an ice skating rink that was operational 24/7. He suggested the Town look at different things to entice people to come.

Mr. Jones stated that he made a motion at the last School Board meeting to start the process of closing schools on July 10<sup>th</sup> and not wait until the last minute.

Mayor Harris stated that the issue with ducks was a Health Department issue and that the droppings ended up at the bottom and mixed with the water treatment and chlorine causing problems. He stated that Dudley may have the oldest building but had the newest addition and that he agreed with Mr. Linkous that they needed to address it.

Mr. Freedman stated that he would not bring back the Cat Ordinance unless otherwise asked to do so. He stated that it was just a draft for them to work off of and nothing more.
